

Nausea	Vitamin B6 50 mg 2x/day OR Vitamin B6 25 mg 4/day ADD Unisom (doxylamine) 1/2-1 pill 3 times daily or just at night as it may cause drowsiness
	Dramamine, Sea Bands (Acupressure)
	Call the clinic if you are unable to hold liquids down, have severe nausea/vomiting, are only urinating a small amount or your urine is dark in color or you feel dizzy or faint when you stand.
Respiratory Virus (Sinus, Nasal congestion & Colds)	Plain Sudafed, Tylenol Cold and Sinus, Flonase, Saline Nasal Spray, Afrin spray (NO MORE than 2x/day and NOT greater than 2-3 days), Guaifenasin (Mucinex), Cool mist vaporizer, Vicks Vapor Rub, Emergen-C
Allergies (Antihistamines)	Claritin, Allegra, Zyrtec, Benadryl, ChlorTabs (Chlorpheniramine), Actifed
Sore Throat & Cough	Lozenges – Cepacol, Chloraseptic, Salt Water Gargle with warm water Cough Drops – Halls, Vicks, or lemon drops Cough syrup containing dextromethorphan (Robitussin plain and DM formulas)
Headache, Pain & Fever	Tylenol or other acetaminophen products: 650-1000 mg every 6-8 hours (up to 3 gm/24 hours) as needed. If not relieved, call the office.
	You should NOT use aspirin or ibuprofen unless directed by a health-care provider
Acid Reflux & Heartburn	Tums, Pepcid, Prilosec, Gaviscon, Maalox, Mylanta
Gas	Simethicone products – Gas X, Mylicon
Constipation	Stool Softeners –Colace (Docusate Sodium) Fiber Laxatives – Miralax, Metamucil (powder, capsules, or wafers), Fibercon
Diarrhea	Kaopectate, Imodium, Imodium AD
	Drink lots of fluids. Avoid dairy products and stop prenatal vitamins until diarrhea subsides. If not resolved in 24-36 hours, call the office.
Insect Bites & Rashes	Lotions – Calamine, Caladryl, Benadryl Hydrocortisone 1% If rash is unusual of persists, call the office
Hemorrhoids	Preparation H, Anusol cream, Tucks or cold with hazel compresses
Vaginal Yeast Infection	Monistat (seven day), Gyne-lotrimin
Sleep	Unisom (doxylamine), Benadryl, Tylenol PM
Acne	Benzoyl Peroxide, Salicylic Acid AVOID Retin-A
